001 - Toddlers

Supply Fee: \$0

Class Maximum: 5/12

202 Intro to Spanish

STEM COURSES

301 Superhero Science

Grade Level: 3rd – 5th

Description: In this class we will be studying the elements of superheroes through the lens of science! Geared for kiddos who take an interest in science and have a love for hands on activities.

302 Game Maker

Grade Level: 3rd-6th

Supply Fee: \$10

Class Min/Maximum: 6/12

Description: This class is all about game making! Students will work in pairs or groups to create twists on games, build a lego brick game, devise a recess game and make a simple video game using iPads with offline apps. We will try out some games together, to get our creativity flowing, then use good teamwork to plan and create games over the semester. Students will also get some time to share about their game and we will try to

test out each others games when possible. The final class will be all about individuality as students will bring their own crafted game (they work on at home over the 10 weeks) to present to us. Wanna be a Game Maker, join us for this class!

303 Stop Motion Maker

Grade Level: 4th-6th

Supply Fee: \$10

Class Min/Maximum: 6/9

Description: Stop Motion Maker is an introduction to stop motion animation using an iPad and app. Students will work in groups of 3 while learning how to use the provided device and app. We will begin the semester by completing simple activities while building teamwork skills and we will progress to longer mini movies with added details like voice over and green screens. This class will focus on basic stop motion skills through hands on application and structured assignments. Students will use drawings, paper, legos and other items throughout the semester to complete short animations and mini movies. All equipment and supplies will be provided and students will be working in locked apps offline with their group. Previous semester students can participate, however, some overlap might occur especially on the weeks where legos are used.

304 Introduction to Astronomy

Grade Level: 4th-8th

Supply Fee: \$35

Class Min/Maximum: 5/15

Description: We will cover: planets, stars, gravity, light, constellations, solar system, galaxies, astronomers of the past, telescopes, theories/models/laws, units of distance & measurement, star death, Earth-Moon relationship...and subtopics therein.

Parental note: the theories/models/laws portion of the class will cover potentially sensitive areas such as creation (big bang vs. creationism), but only as an overview to set a baseline foundation of God being Creator of all, focusing on the majesty of His creation via astronomical study/ observation.

305 Chess Club

Class Min/Maximum: 4/20

Description: This class is for anyone interested in playing chess, even if you have never before played. Novice players will be taught the rules of chess. We will also discuss a few chess strategies and have time in each class to play against fellow students.

501 Woodworking

Students should already be able to single crochet a tight fabric with good stitch definition.

FINE ARTS

601 – Art Time Party

Grade Level: 1st-8th

Supply Fee: Tuition fee is \$109 plus supply fee \$59

Class Min/Maximum: 7/15

Description:

*The **Art Time** program develops creative thinking and fosters self-expression through art. Each class starts with a warm-up exercise that targets specific thinking skills and stimulates the creative process. Then, children apply what they've just learned to the art technique presented that day. Students will work with a variety of high-quality materials including **pastels, watercolors, foil, poster paint, acrylic paint, clay** etc.*

Some of the art projects are designed in the styles of the world's famous artists. While learning new art techniques and discovering different styles, it is up to the children to decide exactly how their art will turn out.

Tuition fee is \$109 plus supply fee \$59 .

There will be an **Exhibit** of children's art work at the end of the semester.

602 – Nature Journaling

Grade Level: 4th-8th

Supply Fee: \$15

Class Min/Maximum: 5/10

Description:

Using a journal deepens our observations, creative thinking, curiosity, and memory; and is a skill that can help students across many subjects and throughout their lives.

In this class, students will learn to observe the world around them and record their observations in a nature journal. Each journal entry will include words, pictures, and numbers to help students think in different ways and make a more complete record of what they see. While we will be writing, drawing, and using numbers with each entry, this is not an English, Art, or Math class... this is an Observation class. The purpose of this class is to sharpen observation skills, which includes learning to record what we see. At the end of each class, students will learn from each other's observations, discovering new ways to observe and record. Class will be held partially indoors and partially outdoors (bring a jacket if it's chilly!), but during inclement weather we will bring some nature inside to observe.

FITNESS COURSES

701 PE/Fitness

Grade Level: 3rd-5th/ 6th-8th

Supply Fee: \$7

Class Min/Maximum: 10/18

Description: Students will develop the knowledge, attitudes, motor skills, behavioral skills, and confidence needed to adopt and maintain physically active lifestyles. Students will be exposed to many different areas of physical fitness and sports, such as: jump roping, basketball, hula hoops, free choice activities, and many structured games.

Required Materials: Students need to wear properly fitting rubber soled tennis shoes and appropriate attire.

702 PE Brain Games and Physical Challenge

Working in teams, this class will put the student's brains to work with a series of puzzles before putting their bodies to the test with a set of physical challenges. (Physical challenges will include but are not limited to: Running, jumping, squats, hand/eye coordination, basketball skills, soccer skills, dodgeball, etc...)

Proper gym clothing and athletic/tennis shoes are required to take this class.

NOTE: This class was previously P.E. Escape Room. If your student took this class last semester some of the puzzles/challenges will be repeated, some are brand new!

703 Recess (3rd-5th)

Grade Level: 3rd-5th

Supply Fee: \$0

Class Min/Maximum: 0/15

Description:

Active students are better learners! Recess increases students' physical activity and improves educational outcomes. Kick off your PAC Day with recess!

Meets on the large playground during first hour. Bring a water bottle. Students are welcome to bring a snack – snack time will be during the last 15 minutes of class. This class is supervised but not structured, students are free to play for the hour. Cold weather - dress warm! Rainy weather - we will meet inside and play board games.

Week 10 will be an end of semester class party and students will work together to create an obstacle course on the playground.
