7th Grade English Tutor: Amy Yarbrough

Course Description: 7th Grade English will emphasize reading skills while gaining an appreciation for different types of literature. Students will also work on their basic writing skills, vocabulary, and grammar. Prerequisites: 7th grade English Grade Level: 8th

Course Description: 8th Grade English will cover both writing and literature, much like a traditional English course. The reading list will be announced later, but will include age-appropriate short stories, poetry, and novels. Students will also learn how to take essay tests and short answer tests. Grammar and vocabulary will be covered as needed. Preliminary Book List: Bulfinch's Mythology: The Age of Fable (we will start with this one!); Hound of the Baskervilles, by Arthur Conan Doyle; A Midsummer Night's Dream, by William Shakespeare; To Kill a Mockingbird, by Harper Lee; The Chosen, by Chaim Potok; and Great Expectations, by Charles Dickens. Other material, poetry, drama, short stories, etc., will be provided by the instructor.

We will learn how to transform graphs of linear, quadratic, exponential, logarithm, and rational. We will learn how to solve many different types of functions. We will be able to change equations into different formats and be able to identify functions in all their forms. When you have completed Algebra 2 you will be prepared to take Calculus and/or College Algebra. Students will have the opportunity to attend a Zoom class check-in session with Mrs. Wilkinson. During this time, Mrs. Wilkinson will be able to review what they learned during class and the students will have that opportunity to ask for extra help.

Honors Chemistry Tutor: Connie Redmond

Prerequisite Required: Algebra I completed **Grade Level:** 10th – 12th

Course Description: This 90-minute class in high school chemistry is designed to give the student a rigorous foundation in chemistry. Topics include significant figures, metric units, the mole concept, stoichiometry, writing chemical formulas, balancing equations, and predicting products etc. Other areas include, equilibrium, thermodynamics, atomic structure, rate of reactions, and redox. Work is a mix of experiments, problem solving, and general theory. Students should be prepared for advanced high school chemistry or freshman college chemistry with the completion of this course. Students will need significant study time outside of class each week for this class. Chemistry is hard but FUN. The new 3rd edition contains more practice problems and more explanation.

Course Description: This course is the last science course a student takes before high school biology. The Apologia text used discusses topics including metrics, matter, atmosphere, the earth, physics of motion, Newton's Laws, and general Chemistry and Physics. In the pre-AP format set up of this class, the student can expect more emphasis on problem - solving and inquiry than the standard Physical Science class. He needs to bring to the class the ability to do basic fractions and simple Algebra. We will use the apologia Physical Science text with a large amount of added material (more labs, more problems, more thinking).

Course Description:

Students will need significant study time outside of class each week for this class. A student doing well in this course should be well prepared for College Physics. Physics is a hard course but an exciting and rewarding one as well. We learn Physics and we learn life.

Course Description: This course will provide a great introduction in the grammar of American Sign Language. The book contains 22 lessons with practice sentences and interesting and innovative exercises for a student to practice their ASL. Each lesson illustrates with pictures how to sign a particular dialogue and then provides the ASL gloss along with the English translation.

The book also introduces Deaf culture which will help students when they interact with Deaf individuals.

Topics: Personal Pronouns, Possessives, Basic Sentence Structure, Negatives, Yes/No Questions, Past and Present Tense, Directional Verbs, Numbers, WH Questions, Plurals, Time, Verb Inflection, Adjective Modulation, Rhetorical Questions, Conditional Sentences, Classifiers, and Shapes.

Learning Outcome 3: The student will demonstrate and comprehend the linguistic components of American Sign Language (grammar) with a minimum of 70% accuracy.

At the beginning of this ASL2 course, we will review the concepts we learned from ASL1 for the benefit of both prior and new students to feel comfortable with the basics before diving further into this amazing language.

Grade Level: 9^{th –} 12th Grade

Course Description: Students will learn the basics of theater and production while producing a full-length play. From auditions through the final performance, students will work on their acting skills, blocking, and learning the technical aspects of theater production. NOTE: This class requires commitment for tech week, the week leading up to the performance of the play in April. Rehearsals will be in the evening during this week, and students must attend. Thus arrangements must be made in advance for students who will miss work or evening activities, because attendance at rehearsal during this week is **mandatory.** Theater is fun and full of joy, but students must be willing to memorize lines and commit to the class, as a play only works if everyone does his or her part.

This class meets twice a week, once at SAC Day on Mondays and at HAAC Day on Wednesdays. The Wednesday class meets from 3-4PM. There will be a parents' meeting in September, as we will be re-activating the famous SAC Day "Drama Mamas." For each family in Drama, one parent must sign up for one task for the play. Most jobs are not time-consuming and take place only during tech-week, ie picking up snacks for rehearsal (budget provided), etc.

Students will learn the Principles of Art and the Elements of Design and will apply them by learning how to draw using lines and shading to create drawings in perspective and human portraits by using pencil, chalk, and charcoal mediums. Students will also create a color wheel learning how to mix paint to create secondary and intermediate colors and then applying this knowledge by painting on canvas using acrylic paints. Positive and negative space will also be explored by completing a glass etching project, followed by learning and applying the role of texture in art by completing a weaving. Students will use patterns and follow pattern instructions to complete projects. Students will make pillows, plushies, Christmas stockings, pumpkin centerpieces, and other fun projects. Students have the option to learn to alter their own clothing items.

Description: We use computers in many aspects of our daily lives. Public and private schools are providing students with introductory courses in programming and desktop software applications. Shouldn't our homeschool students have the same advantage? I taught my two older sons their first computer science class when they were twelve and ten years old. They were so excited about computers that they are still active in that field. My oldest graduated from A&M with a computer science degree and my second oldest works in network communications today.

C# is a modern, general-purpose programming language developed by Microsoft and is easy to learn. Students will develop their understanding of programming fundamentals: input/output operations, decision making, and looping. They will have many opportunities for hands-on

experience programming real-life examples. They will build a professional-looking and intuitive Graphical User Interface (GUI) application on their own computer. We will be using CompuScholar online course, which provides video and text explanation of all the lessons. I will provide accountability, guidance, and grading of their work. CompuScholar online course, Windows Programming (C#) requires Windows OS.

Topics Covered This course covers fundamental programming topics and skills such as:

- Using Integrated Development Environments
- C# Data types and variables
- Logical expressions and flow control
- Math and string operations
- GUI design and Windows input controls
- Writing functions
- Debugging and exceptions
